Believing that the Bible is the perfect treasure of heavenly instruction; divinely inspired, without error, and wholly trustworthy:

We will strive to diligently study God's Word and submit our lives to its authority in all matters of faith and conduct.

Believing that our chief end is to glorify and enjoy God forever:

We will strive, in all we do, to glorify and enjoy the God of our salvation; for from Him and through Him and to Him are all things. To Him be all glory forever!

Believing that biblical marriage and the Christian home were divinely ordained by God:

We will strive to uphold a biblical understanding of marriage and to train our children in the discipline and instruction of the Lord, seeking to live in a way that adorns the Gospel of Christ before our family, friends, and neighbours.

Believing that our possessions are God's gifts to us:

We will strive to be faithful stewards of all that God has given to us by contributing cheerfully and generously to the preservation of the church and the proclamation of the gospel. *Mt* 28:19; *Lk* 12:33; 2 Co 9:7

Believing in the divine conception and preservation of the Church:

We will strive not to neglect assembling together, but to support and treasure the biblical preaching of the whole counsel of God, the faithful observance of Baptism and the Lord's Supper, the loving exercise of church discipline, and the humble pursuit of corporate prayer. Believing that Jesus has called us to love one another, just as He has loved us:

We will strive to eagerly maintain the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace by building one another up in love and by putting away all bitterness, anger, and slander.

Believing that God has made us one body in Jesus Christ:

We will strive to love one another in all our varied circumstances and spiritual states; bearing each other's weaknesses and failings with tenderness and compassion; and warning and rebuking each other with all humility, gentleness, and patience.

Believing that Christ has commissioned the Church to make disciples of all nations:
